Club Descriptions

Reading & Math Skills: Students will work on skills specific to their individual Numeracy and Literacy needs.

Robotics & Coding: Robotics and coding help students build 21st century STEAM skills, explore virtual reality, and help students solidify skills and knowledge they will need in their future studies. Developing strong computer coding skills will help students compete and succeed in future lessons and academic situations. There are two offerings for this club. One for grades 1-3 and another for grades 4-6.

Yoga: Yoga combines physical postures, breathing, and meditation to improve physical and mental well-being. It can help build flexibility, reduce stress, build strength, and manage pain.

Team Sports: Students will engage in a variety of team sports activities. This will help build communication skills, balance, speed, agility, coordination, and help create a community of teamwork and school spirit. There are two offerings for this club. One for grades 1-3 and another for grades 4-6.

Spanish club: This club will enhance students' communication skills and cultural awareness through conversational practice and cultural activities. It will be educational by supporting language learning, beneficial by fostering collaboration and respect for diversity, and impactful by preparing students to engage in a global community. Aligned with our school's vision and mission, the club promotes the development of skills and values that strengthen both Mojave culture and students' connection to the wider world.

Journaling & Scrapbooking club: Journaling and Scrapbooking can be valuable tools for students, offering numerous benefits for their mental well-being, academic performance, and personal development. Journaling provides a private space for self-reflection, stress management, and emotional processing, enhancing focus, creativity, and visual learning.

Glee club: Students will be singing various types of music. There will be an opportunity for audition and practice for the Winter show at the Bullhead Amphitheater on Dec. 11th. Northern Star Event - (Live Nativity) after the Winter show.

Arts & Crafts: The Arts and Crafts Afterschool Club offers students a creative space to explore their imagination, develop hands-on skills, and express themselves through a variety of artistic projects. Through guided activities such as painting, drawing, sculpting, and crafting, students will strengthen problem-solving, fine motor, and design skills while also fostering collaboration and patience. *This club will be open to grades 2+.*

Origami: This club offers students a fun, creative, and educational activity through the art of paper folding. Students will learn to create various models, enhancing fine motor skills, spatial reasoning, attention to detail, and problem-solving strategies while fostering patience and focus. This club provides a supportive environment for artistic expression, and can offer stress relief and promote mindfulness.

Bird Singing & Dancing: In this club students will be able to learn and practice traditional Mojave bird dancing and singing along with the knowledge & history of bird.

Farm to table: Students will explore where our food comes from, gardening-including herbs and pollinators; nutrition with healthy snacks; recycling; formal place setting; manners at the table.

Lego club: This club supports STEAM, utilizing processes such as planning, problem solving, and belonging to the school community. Students will use their creativity and imagination to design and/or build Lego structures while developing social skills and working relationships among peers.

Music club: This club includes singing, dancing, and instruments. This club will provide an outlet where students can explore their creativity while also building their cognitive skills, language development, and social skills. Skills such as memory, attention, problem-solving, and math skills are supported. Students will build skills in cooperation, communication, empathy, diversity, confidence and self-esteem. Music club also contributes to physical development by improving coordination, balance and gross and fine motor skills. *This club will have a limit of 10 students.*
